## Percussive Ukulele Tenthumbspro.com

A small understanding of drums would help a little bit, we are trying to recreate the sound of three drums

The bass drum: the bass drum is the big round one in the middle of a drum set, that often times says the name of the band, this drum is played with a pedal and the foot, and it has a low bass sound. In a basic drum beat it is very common to hear this drum on the  $1^{st}$  and  $3^{rd}$  beats of a normal measure in 4/4.

To create this sound on the Ukulele we hit the bridge with the side of our thumbs.

**The Snare:** The snare is the drum that is common to hear for drum rolls in marching bands, the little drummer boy is based on the snare drum. This drum is struck with a stick. In common modern music this drum takes place on the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  beat of a measure in 4/4.

To create this sound we will be doing a mute, or a chunk strum. If you are unfamiliar with this style here is a link. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FypFf8YjcM8

**The High-hat:** The high at is two metal cymbals stacked on top of each other that are opened and closed with the foot. The make a brief metallic noise and in a basic drum pattern they are played in 1/8 patterns, or 8 times in one measure, this would be counted as 1 & 2 & 3 & 4 &, although we will note be playing, or strumming, in a constant  $8^{\rm th}$  pattern.

After practicing these sounds independently we will put them all together. T= thumb slap on bridge, D= Down strum, U= Upstrum and X= a muted or chunk strum. Note the up strums on the  $16^{\rm th}$  beat before the mutes.
